**Position: Water Technician I
(Non-Exempt)**

Objective:

Under supervision of the Water System Supervisor, the Water Technicians I performs a variety of tasks including daily field operations and maintenance of the distribution system.

Job Description:

Assist in the operation of maintenance, installation and repairs of the distribution system. Understands the operation of wells, pumps, and motors with minimal guidance. Performs monthly, yearly maintenance programs such as valve maintenance, pump maintenance, and fire hydrant maintenance. Understands the operation of the water system and knows how to shut down a pressurized system. Understands and executes the Company's water treatment process with a basic understanding of chlorine and chloramines.

Understands and utilizes the water systems Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) control system. This includes specific training in the ClearScada software, monitoring, making flow and chemical adjustments under supervision, troubleshooting and operating company facilities/equipment.

Establishes and maintains a cooperative working relationship with co-workers, outside agencies and the public.

The position is responsible to:

- Fill in for the Lead Worker or System Supervisor as required.
- Performs routine maintenance of the Company's fleet as needed.
- Performs Underground Service Alert (USA) excavating ticket requests by marking Company facilities.
- Per the Emergency Response Plan all utility personnel is required to respond to either localized or widespread emergencies (Section 3100 et seq.). Coordinate and assist with the response of emergencies.
- Keep thorough documentation of water system repairs and maintenance by using the Company's geographic information system (GIS) and shared files with the office staff.
- Keep all tool/equipment in good working condition.
- Other tasks as deemed necessary by the Lead Worker or Water System Supervisor.
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License/Certification and Other Requirements

- Maintain a valid California Driver's License with a good driving record
- Must possess a high school diploma or equivalent
- Must be able to obtain a Grade I Treatment Certificate within six (6) months
- Must be able to obtain a Grade I Distribution Certificate within six (6) months

- Be on-call once every three weeks and provide support, as needed, to others on off-weeks
- Must maintain a principal residence within a 30-minute safe-response-time to the water system.
